Minutes of the Annual All Church Meeting

Virtual meeting via Zoom

Parish Reports

Father Lock encourages parishioners to read through all of the reports.

Building and Grounds chair - future warden Rob Birn

Trinity has always been an important landmark in RB - based on our location. Cracks are now obvious, as the building is over 150 years old. It's time to repair/restore the exterior. Bell Tower needs to be removed and rebuilt.

Windows/doors need to be replaced as well. Thorough review was done, the most qualified company was chosen. Scaffolding will soon be visible for this project. We have some funding through our capital campaign. The remainder of the funding will be discussed by the Vestry. But please feel free to donate to these hefty projects.

Steve Leech

Q: Stained Glass window in the bell tower - are we looking to do anything additional to better light that window?

A : Yes, part of that restoration includes the inside of the bell tower. Ground, middle, and top levels will all be restored.

David Parkes

Q: How long will the project take?

A: Project will commence weather permitting. Work will start with the bell tower and the stucco will happen in the Spring. A 3 month window is expected.

Q: Will the exterior on the west side be repaired, by the ramp?

A: Entire building, all facades, will be painted.

Q: Does this impact any of the rental space?

A: We don't expect any severe construction to take place in their entry area but there will be sound issues that we will make our tenants aware of.

Lorraine Lathrop

Q: Have we looked into grants for historical landmark buildings?

A: We don't qualify because the actual structure was built over many years, many additions and gutted by fire in 1968.

Glori Diaz

Q: You mentioned 3 months - will this work start in 3 months from now?

A: Most stucco repair work will take place in warmer months and we're trying to take advantage of the winter time period to do the interior work. Phase 2 will be the remaining buildings Phase 3, painting and mortar proofing. Time/materials budget allows for breaks in between the 3 months - Spring will see the most work.

Treasury Report

Father Lock introduced retiring Treasurer **Bill Stryker** and thanked him for his work. **Scott Landau** will be incoming Treasurer.

Ended 2020 on a positive financial note. Pledges were met or exceeded. Several sent in remaining pledges from last year. Bill and the Vestry thank you for your faithful support of Trinity

With fewer custodial hours, not paying the choir, our balance sheet has increased over the year - saving us more money for capital.

Rental income set aside for the building project.

\$2000 for contingencies (replacing the Cochran fund.)

For the last decade, Bill has been the Treasurer. He let us know that it's been an honor to have served the church, helping it to grow spiritually and financially. *The honor has been ours Bill, thank you for your faithful service!*

Fr. John gifted Bill with a framed psalm.

Scott Landau - thanked Bill/Tony/Candy for their help in his first year.

Through Covid - due to continued pledges, we ended up with a \$30,000 surplus.

Thank you to David Parkes - keeping our tenants and secured 2 new leases. We're positioned well.

Pledged have increased for 2021 to \$260k.

This year's budget allocates \$150k to the construction project. So we need ways to supplement this now \$130k deficit. We have \$71k allocated to the building fund so there is cash available to start the project.

PPP loan - \$26k from the government. We're hoping this will be forgiven and taken off the balance sheet shortly. Candy added, the vestry will communicate shortly what the fundraising opportunities will be.

Glori Diaz

Q: The \$26k, is that part of the \$71?

A: No, we have allocated funds over the years, earmarked for capital improvements. The \$26k was part of the PPP loan from the federal government . We owe it back until it's forgiven (which we expect it to be)

Thank you Scott for stepping up to be Treasurer, we appreciate your professional expertise.

Warden's Report

Candy submitted the Warden's report, here are the highlights.

2020 was a tough year, but we want to acknowledge the Lock family for their consistent contributions.

This church is about community - and we're looking forward to being together again in community, no masks, singing in the traditions that we love. We'll be back there soon!

Rector's Report

Fr. John thanked all those who have helped Trinity this year, staff, Vestry and volunteers. Even with many challenges, we managed to continue our Outreach efforts and continue our worship. We were able to bond in the midst of a crisis and grow spiritually.

WARDEN'S REPORT

BUILDINGS AND GROUNDS

On behalf of the Building and Grounds Committee, I am happy to report that the Restoration Project repair work is complete. As you all witnessed, there was extensive damage that required several exterior walls to be rebuilt. The bell tower walls were fortified, all cracks were repaired, and a new coat of stucco was applied. We replaced several windows and doors, waterproofed the entire building, and repainted all exterior walls and trim. In addition, as a late add-on project, we replaced and repaired several sections of gutters and reconnected all leaders so that all roof water runs into the underground drainage system. Water damage has plagued our church exterior for many years, and we have taken all the necessary actions to preserve our beautiful church and protect it for many years to come.

Phase one of our Restoration Project was the physical remodel of our building. Phase two is the recognition and commemoration of all our wonderful donors. This construction project would not have been possible without all the various donations from our parishioners and friends that helped us offset most of our expenses. We are beyond blessed for everyone's contributions, and we plan to recognize all our donors at a special event this Spring. Please note that our Stewardship Committee will be reaching out to our larger donors to confirm the text that will be engraved on the commemorative plaques.

Thank you for everyone's support to help keep our church looking beautiful. As we kick off a new year, the Building and Grounds committee still have more projects to work on. We need to repair and patch the flat roof over the parish hall and remodel the bathrooms next to the kitchen. These capital expenses and several building maintenance costs are included in our annual budget, but nominated donations to our Building Fund are always welcome.

RECTOR'S REPORT

2021 began in the middle of the Delta variant of Covid-19, and we ended the year with the Omicron variant. You might conclude that what happened here at Trinity in 2021 was only about corona-virus, and while the pandemic is certainly part of the story, it is by no means the biggest or most important thing that happened at Trinity this year. Like 2020 it's been a year of tremendous blessings from the Lord, not without, of course, some notable hardships.

In general 2021 has seen a gradual return to a degree of normalcy. We moved from one in-person service which was held from January through August to two services from September on, with a significant uptick in attendance. The summer mission trip for youth and young people went from a local outreach in 2020 to the week-long overnight format that has been our custom for over a decade. Morning Prayer was held on Facebook through July. In September, with the support of many lay-readers, we returned to in-person Morning Prayer four days a week. Sunday School went from being held virtually in the spring to being in-person this fall with the support of two amazing young adults, Matt Johnson and Maggie McFaddon. Since July 2020 we had been administering Holy Communion in one kind only, but in December of 2021 the bishop, recognizing that the common cup does nothing to further the spread of covid, permitted again administration in both kinds. Comparing the attendance from Christmas 2020 to Christmas 2021 shows that things are improving. At our largest service—the family service on Christmas Eve we more than doubled our attendance year over year. All of this suggests that we are heading in the right direction as we try to make our way out of the lethargy of the pandemic that has so adversely affected so many churches.

It has been the vestry's and my principle that we would always take a "liberalizing" policy, that is, whenever we were permitted to return to a degree of pre-pandemic normalcy, we always took it. We felt strongly that we should not normalize precautions and procedures that were only intended as emergency strictures to protect the most vul-

nerable. By contrast, I was saddened to read on a church website not too long ago: "We do not know when we will return to in-person worship, but when we do, we know *nothing* will be the same." Of course we have to be open to growing and changing, and the pandemic has been an excellent learning opportunity, but to say that nothing will ever be the same borders on faithlessness. After all the message of the Gospel is that despite wars, upheavals, and sicknesses, God's abiding grace and love endures and does not change! I think we have done an excellent job of changing and adopting through the course of the pandemic but also clinging to the unchanging truth of the Lord.

Perhaps most noteworthy of all in 2021 was the restoration which tackled the decaying exterior of our expansive facility. Water damage had so eroded the stucco that we were beginning to see significant damage inside of the building. As I've told many of you before, I will never forget the day when the engineer came to inspect the church and told me, "Father, I'm not sure if we can save your bell tower, but we're going to try." At the time she did not even mention or was unaware of the damage to the parish hall which we later learned was even more insidious than that of the bell tower. The engineer also said to me that day: "Father, I hope you're a good fund-raiser." Neither of these was terribly encouraging in the moment! Of the many subjects I studied in the seminary, I'm afraid fund-raising was not one of them. It's not something that comes easily or naturally to me (as I suspect is true for most people), but together with the vestry and stewardship committee, the Lord really gave us a purpose and vision to see and fund this altogether necessary and urgent project. I am so thankful to the many individuals who donated to the restoration. It's a true gift to future generations, and it enables us to focus on what we're here for: to worship the Lord in the beauty of holiness and to spread the message of his grace in this community and beyond. What a privilege for me to serve in a place where God moves the people to give generously and they listen to his voice to support the witness and ministry of this church! I encourage you to go back and watch the pre-restoration video on youtube. It's a sobering sight indeed. I will never tire of extending my thanks to Rob Birn and the buildings and grounds committee for the close supervision of this project and the coordination of the many elements and contractors involved.

On the agenda for 2022 is the recognition and rededication of the church following the conclusion of the restoration. The wardens, vestry, and stewardship committee are actively working on planning this celebration. We're also hoping to bring back Bible study in a more intentional manner than has been feasible through the pandemic. Some thought has been given to a mid-week Bible study. We may also try small groups again for a fixed number of weeks as was done in 2018 and 2019. If you are interested in this, and want to be involved in the planning or execution of any of these endeavors, please see me or the wardens. Finally, we look forward to welcoming back more of our members in 2022 as, Lord-willing, pandemic trends continue to improve. I do not think it an over-statement to say that we have truly been renewed through the course of the pandemic—in the building of course, but also in worship and music, in outreach and evangelism. May the Lord continue to bless our work and ministry for his glory and the spread of his kingdom.
